**Robert J. Barro** is Robert C. Waggoner Professor of Economics at Harvard University. He has a B.S. in physics from Caltech and a Ph.D. in economics from Harvard, and he previously held faculty positions at Rochester, Chicago, and Brown. He is a viewpoint columnist for *Business Week*, a senior fellow of the Hoover Institution at Stanford, and a Research Associate of the National Bureau of Economic Research. In 2003 he was president-elect of the Western Economic Association, in 1997–98 he was vice president of the American Economic Association, and in 1994–95 he was Houbton-Norman Research Fellow at the Bank of England. He is married to Rachel McCleary, with whom he codirects the Project on Religion, Economy, and Society at Harvard University.
